What is Dominant Culture

- Dominant culture is the position of influence to control social structure such as education, politics, language spoken, rituals practices, etc.
- Dominant culture can change over time
- All of us participate inside the dominant culture and outside of the dominant culture influence
- The goal is to successfully move in and out of personal/ family culture and dominant culture

Cultural Curiosity Begins with Listening From a Place of Wanting to Understand

Respectful Listening

Listen without assumptions

Listen from the perspective of the other

Listen from a place of learning

Listen without correcting the speaker

Listen for feedback that increased your cultural knowledge

Once you start speaking you stop listening
